Marking in your textbook is not allowed. The following is a list of examples that are considered markings or damage to a textbook for which a student can be fined:

- Circling questions or words in the glossary to complete for homework.
- Underlining words or phrases of text.
- Scribbles on pages.
- Scribbles or writing on the edge of the book binding.
- Defacing the cover.
- Tearing the cover.
- Writing your name or names multiple times on the inside front cover.
- Tagging and other unacceptable forms of writing on the inside front and inside back covers, as well as any other page of the book. This includes drawing pictures, stickers and stamps.
- Writing notes to friends.
- Writing foul language.
- Scratching front cover intentionally or unintentionally.
- Exposing the textbook to liquid contaminants.

Helpful hints for Students:

You are responsible for the condition of the textbook checked out to you. To ensure your textbook is returned with little or no wear and tear:

- A) Keep your book covered at all times.
- B) Carry your textbook in a back pack.
- C) Do not let your friends borrow your book to take to their class.
- D) Do not share your locker with other students. This will prevent your book from being used by other students in their classroom.

Remember, the book is checked out in your name. If it is returned to the bookroom with any markings or damage, you will be fined, not your friends.
